

**ORDINANCE NO. 3422**

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE MAXIMUM MILL LEVY RATE FOR THE LIBRARY FUND FOR THE CITY OF IOLA, KANSAS AS PRESCRIBED BY CHARTER ORDINANCE NO. 10 OF THE CITY OF IOLA, KANSAS AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF IOLA, KANSAS:

SECTION 1: The maximum mill levy rate for the City of Iola's Library Fund shall be adjusted from the 2013 rate of 5.715 mills to 5.938 mills for the 2014 budget to ensure that the library remains eligible for state and regional grants.

SECTION 2: Iola Municipal Code, Section 86-2 Library fund; maximum mill levy rate, shall be amended to read, "The maximum mill levy rate for the city library fund shall be as established at 5.938.

SECTION 3: All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its publication in the official City newspaper.
